Biographical Note

Benjamin Franklin Whitehouse was born on March 14th, 1848, in South Burwick, Maine. At the age of 14 he enlisted as a drummer boy in Company A, 12th New Hampshire Infantry to fight in the Civil War. At the age of 15, he enlisted as a Private in Company C, 1st Ohio Volunteers (Heavy Artillery), where he served to the end of the Civil War as a drummer, fifer, and bugler.

At the age of 16, he was in the Army of the Cumberland under General Sherman. He participated in most of its battles, including the Battles of Chattanooga, Kennesaw Ridge, and Petersburg. He was a member of Sherman's "March to the Sea", and was wounded twice.

In 1867, at the age of 19, he enlisted in the regular army and was sent as a bugler to Infantry at Fort Grant, Arizona. He was in Arizona Territory in campaigns against the Apaches from 1867 to 1869. In 1870, he was transferred with the 14th regiment to Chattanooga, TN, where he was discharged.

Whitehouse stated that in 1872, he re-enlisted in the Regular Army and was assigned to Company I, U.S. 7th Cavalry as bugler with General Custer's Expeditionary Force to the Dakota Territories. He was assigned to Custer as aide and chief trumpeter, and traveled with the expeditionary force up the Missouri River. From Ft. Lincoln, he rode with Custer throughout the Yellowstone and Black Hills campaigns to contain the Sioux Indians. In 1876, he intended to re-enlist, but was discharged for a visit to Ohio. After the Battle of the Little Bighorn, he did not re-enlist and instead decided to homestead in Dakota Territory, where he spent the winters painting and decorating. BF Whitehouse's time in the 7th Cavalry cannot be verified due to his enrollment using an assumed name. His whereabouts during this time also cannot be surmised using historical records, leaving his statements as the only record of this era in his life.

In 1899, at the age of 51, he married Sara Price, and they had two sons, Lewis Franklin and George Edward. Over the years he was very active in civic and political activities. He attended Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) encampments as Chief Bugler of the South Dakota division. He was a popular speaker at public events, and traveled the Chautauqua Circuit putting on shows as a campfire singer, storyteller and entertainer.

In his later years, he corresponded with Elizabeth Custer (General Custer's widow) and even volunteered to serve the country during WWI, although the governor was unable to accept volunteers for the war. He spent his time writing poetry, telling stories, and working on his memoirs. On October 31st, 1936, he passed away at the Old Soldier's Home in Hot Springs, SD. He was 88 years old.

Collection Summary

The collection is a compilation of materials which reflect Benjamin Franklin Whitehouse's life primarily from his involvement in the civil war to his death in 1938. The biographical and original works series, items include copies of certificates and correspondence about his life between researchers and family and the manuscript items he wrote-in particular his poems and essays. The newspaper and publications, photograph, and artifact series contain materials he collected throughout his life-news articles about General Custer and the war, fliers from his speaking engagements, photographs of various places he had been (both purchased and taken), and artifacts from his various engagements- items he used as a soldier, mementos from geographic areas he had visited or been stationed, and conventions he attended.

Collection Arrangement

The collection is arranged into 5 series: biographical, original works, newspapers and publications, photographs, and artifacts. Within the biographical and original works series, the files are arranged alphabetically. The newspapers and publications series is arranged in chronological order; if an item has no date it is arranged alphabetically at the beginning of the series. The photographs series are arranged by first alphabetically then in numerical order (when applicable).
