### **Biographical Note**

Helen Bergh was born June 5, 1908 on her family's homestead near Aberdeen. She graduated from Aberdeen Central High School, and later attended Northern State College where she earned both a Bachelor's of Science Degree and Master's of Science Degree. She then taught in a one-room rural school for forty-three years. Helen Burgh was heavily involved in community school programs, including the Brown County Rural School Music Festival, Young Citizens League, and the Student Practice Teaching Programs through Northern State College. She also both helped establish and promote Aberdeen's Annual Festival of Nations.

During World War II she was involved with the Canteen Program in Aberdeen. She helped to establish the Dacotah Prairie Museum, working there from 1971-1990 and later was honored with the dedication of the Helen Bergh Room. She was involved in a variety of area organizations including Brown County Territorial Pioneers, South Dakota-Brown County Centennial Committee, the Brown County Historical Society, Delta Kappa Gama Society, American Association of University Women, the Lyre Music Club, Business nad Professional Women, the James Valley Pioneer Threshing Association, Brookside Extension Club, Dakota Midland Corral of Westerners International, and the Cherry Creek Republican Women's Club. Helen Burgh was proud of her service to the community and received many acknowledgements for her efforts such as, being named First Lady of Aberdeen in 1978, being inducted into the South Dakota Hall of Fame, Who's Who of American Women, and Distinguished Alumni from Northern State College. She also received the Sertoma Services to Mankind Award, Outstanding Friend of Education Award, and the Certificate of Commendations award from the State and Local History Association.
