Biographical Note

Nora Staael Evert (December 2, 1904 – 2003) was a student at Northern Normal and Industrial School in the 1920s. She went on to work as a teacher, coach, physical therapist, and college professor. As a physical therapist, Nora witnessed the changes in modern physical medicine, especially with polio medicine. Her story caught the eye of Dr. Dave Grettler, a History professor at Northern State University, after her husband donated her interviews. Based on these interviews, recorded in 1994-95 by JoAnne Rubic and Janet Hulme, Dr. Grettler wrote a book on Nora's life, entitled Nora Staael Evert: A Life in Motion.

Scope and Content

The formats in this collection include photographs, handwritten notes, manuscripts, and cds. This collection is mostly unarranged. The items within this collection are divided into two series. The first series, *Nora's Personal Items*, was donated by Dr. John Evert. The second series, *Dr. Grettler's Book Preparation*, is comprised of items that Dr. Grettler produced during his book research. This collection is entirely in English.
